We started with Foot Washing, to remind all of us that, as Leaders we are here to serve.


We role played, we learned. "Be Authentic [and be vulnerable]."



## **Bethesda clinic**

This article is to introduce you to Fegens Saint-Louis. Fegens graduated at the top of his class from the OFCB High School (College Classic de Bayonnais) in 2012. In the 13th grade, he received the highest score in the Haitian National Exams in the state of Artibonite. He entered medical school in January 2013 at Université Quisqueya (Quisqueya University). After a successful course of study Fegens expects to graduate in the December, 2018. After that he will spend one year doing an internship and one year in social service. The location of these years as well as his residency will be determined by the Haitian medical board. All of his education and training is expected to be in Haiti. After completing his basic medical training Fegens would like to further his education, specializing in infectious diseases. His long term goal is to do research in order to contribute to eradicating infectious diseases such as AIDS, Cholera, Tuberculosis, etc. in the poorest countries like Haiti.





Answers to the question, "Why am I here?", were from the heart. The answers from Wallace, Alderin and Vanel (left) sum up pretty well what the group came for and what they achieved.

The wrap up to the workshop was Communion – to remind us that we are forgiven and renewed, the reading of the Covenant – which the Haitians developed amongst themselves, and Commissioning – to celebrate the accomplishments of the group.

At the airport, I asked Nathan, "So what happened?" His answer: "The group absorbed into their very souls the teachings from the workshop. They left with energy, and they are already better leaders."

Postscript: Actionnel and I talk frequently about what concepts each individual is practicing, how the group is working together to buoy each other up, and what is different. Each time, he shares with me specific interactions where he and others are employing the new way of being. In a recent conversation, when Actionnel said, "Hello, Dow" I heard something in the background and asked, "What was that?" He laughed and said, "Oh, that was Yolande reminding me, 'Be Authentic!" Sure evidence that the concepts have taken hold!!
